Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

During this year we did not transfer any monies to the Project in India as the School and Projects were actually closed due to the Pandemic.

Financial review

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

All funds raised are designed to be directed towards the primary projects as soon as possible within the context of the stated annual plans. It is not intended to maintain reserves excepting they are the accumulation of funds for the next stage of each of the project areas.

Details of any deficit

From time to time there will be an operating deficit within one financial year on paper. This is because funds are accrued over more than one financial period to allow for a larger project to be funded. There will never be a deficit in the funds held centrally in the Bank, since surplus funds are carried forward into the next financial year.

Donated facilities and services (if any)

Accountancy Services have been donated as a gift without charge to the Project by the Accountant.

Other optional information

The objectives of the Project continue to be: the physical improvement of the village of Mangamanuthu in Tamil Nadu, assistance in the provision of education in the schools administered by the Marist Brothers in Tamil Nadu, specifically St. Marcellin High School, Mangamanuthu and the Marist Primary and Secondary schools in P.Udayapatti, and a nursery/primary school in Vizhalanmedu

Originally set up by staff and pupils of Lawside RC Academy, the India Village Project is now supported by St. Paul's RC Academy and St. John's High School, St. Ninian's Primary School in Hamilton and a number of Primary Schools in Dundee. The Project also committed funds to Operation Rainbow, which provides education, medication and clothing for the children of some of the poorest families in Tamil Nadu where AIDS is a problem. These children are prevented from accessing mainstream education because of a misunderstanding of the mechanisms of HIV and AIDS.

We also held our annual India Week and India Concert in collaboration with the Bharatiya Ashram.

Other Information.

We continue to transfer money to the two nominated bank accounts in Trichy, which are administered by the Marist Brothers, one for the provision of funds for school projects and one for the provision of funds for Operation Rainbow.

The membership of the board of Trustees has not changed this year. The signatories for the India Village Project Bank Account (Bank of Scotland) are also unchanged.
